I look forward to tutoring my students every weekend because of their jubilant personalities that brighten up my day after a long and stressful week in high school. Although these two students do not have the best education and learning abilities, they come to class eager to improve on their English skills to communicate and write better. While tutoring these children, I have reflected on myself and learned many lessons that have contributed to self growth as a leader and contributing member of society.

To begin, my students' immense passion for learning has inspired me to try my best every session. There have been days where my students don't cooperate or they are tired after a long day. Sometimes, my students arrive unmotivated to class because their parents interrupted them while they were playing their favorite games. In these moments, I had to adjust and put myself in the child's shoes. Therefore, I learned how to encourage my students and provide incentives such as educational games to enhance the learning of my students. I recognized that a class without engagement is a class without learning because if my students are bored, they will not grasp the information. By implementing various techniques, I not only gained the trust and built a strong bond with the students, I also saw improved grades in their English classes. This motivation and desire to learn, truly inspired me to be the best tutor I can be. The students' energy and stories they told me always made my day and inspired me to be positive like them.
